

A FULL TUITION SCHOLARSHIP IN PARTNERSHIP WITH



Purpose

- To encourage and assist youth from Caribbean countries who currently reside in Ontario to pursue their educational goals at Seneca Polytechnic.
- To recognize academic effort, community involvement and contributions to the Caribbean community in Ontario.

Number and Value of Awards

One (1) Full Tuition Scholarship valued up to \$6,000.00 per year for up to 4 years to a qualifying student for the duration of the program the student applied for and was admitted into.

The scholarship is non-transferable and begins in the 2025 academic year.

Award criteria

1. Applications for this financial aid award can only be reviewed by CCAC if they are received from applicants who have already been accepted to Seneca for the upcoming academic year;
2. Applications for this financial aid award will be evaluated according to CCAC's existing criteria and application form;
3. Should those criteria change at any point in the future, CCAC will inform Seneca of the change;
4. Seneca reserves the right to request changes to the criteria or to terminate this agreement should criteria not align with Seneca's values;
5. Seneca reserves the right to terminate funding to any student whose conduct does not meet Seneca's standards of conduct;
6. To receive renewable awards for the duration of the program, the recipients must maintain the minimum GPA requirements for their specified program as outlined in [Seneca's Student Progression and Promotion Policy](#).

Termination

Either party may terminate this agreement, providing 90 days' notice of termination in writing to the other party.

Should this agreement be terminated, Seneca agrees to grandfather financial aid to any students who have yet to complete the academic program funded by the award until their program is completed.

Eligibility: Applicants must meet the following criteria:

1. Be a first year or continuing student enrolled at Seneca Polytechnic;
2. a) If not a member of one of the CCAC Member Associations, be no older than 24 years of age

as of August 31, in the year of application, but whose parents, guardians or grandparents are of Caribbean descent;

OR

- b) Be a Financial/Honorary Member of one of the CCAC Member Associations that is in good financial standing, regardless of his/her age;
- 3. Demonstrate active involvement in the community or engagement in extracurricular school activities.
- 4. Attend the presentation ceremony to receive this scholarship.

Adjudication

A Selection Committee consisting of representatives from the CCAC community and appointed by the Board of the CCAC will be responsible for administering the selection process. The committee will select recipients, and its decision shall be final.

Application package

You will be judged on the state of completion of your applications. Your application will be rejected unless documents listed below are included and contained on the Letterhead of the institution, dated, and signed by the issuing official.

The following documents must be included in your application package, and points will be awarded as shown in brackets.

- 1. Completed application form (up to 10 points)
- 2. A copy of your most recent Academic transcript. (up to 10 Points)
- 3. Proof of enrollment to the qualifying university/college/trade school (up to 10 points)
- 4. Two letters of reference:
 - a. One from an academic institution attended within the past two years (up to 5 points)
 - b. One from a community member other than a parent (up to 5 points)These letters must explain:
 - i. How the referee came to know you.
 - ii. How long has the referee known you.
 - iii. Why the referee thinks you are deserving of the award.
- 5. An essay of approximately 250 words, written by the applicant, explaining why the applicant should be selected (up to 10 points)
- 6. Details of academic achievements (up to 10 points)
- 7. Demonstrate financial need. (up to 10 points)
- 8. Details of volunteer activities and any community leadership roles assumed (up to 10 point)
- 9. Demonstrate active involvement in Caribbean Community organizations/programs. (up to 20 points)

Obligations of the Recipients

The recipients are encouraged to participate in future CCAC programs and be willing to serve as role models in the CCAC Community.
